

Women face signi, cant challenges in a time of climate change, and the also pla a ke role in helping to na igate the o erall sit ation that res Its from these iss es. This is especiall tre for Palestinian omen, hos ffer from special economic conditions and a political sit ation that creates climate impacts in the West Bank.

Palestinian omen often and themsel es at the center of the fallo t from climate crises. The pla a central role in a areness of the problem, rationalization of cons mption, en ironmental protection, and reso recemanagement ithin their societ. Yet, j st as omen in the region are e pected to change the beha ior of their

families in order to preser e nat ral reso rces and confront the phenomenon of climate change, man social, economic and political factors impede them from doing so.

This st d ill foc s on an important q estion: What is the en ironmental a areness of Palestinian omen in marginalized areas, especiall those ho li e in remote comm nities? It also ill present an anal sis of the capabilities of Palestinian omen in administrati e and societal decision-making in the face of spatial change. This anal sis ill meas re Palestinian omen's capabilities in en ironmental management in a moment of increasing climate impacts, as







ell as to artic late both the challenges the face and the realit of seeking gender j stice in marginalized areas. This st d ill also la o t the agric It ral practices relied pon b omen and e amine the problem of en ironmental ed cation in the face of climate change, e isting agric It ral patterns, and modern practices incl ding ater reso ree management and en ironmental ed cation in the conte t of the famil.

This anal sis relies pon e idence of the spatial distrib tion associated ith the effects of climate change and omen's a areness, cartographic distrib tion of the effects of climate change in the st d area, and spatial distrib tion maps of en ironmental a areness meas res for Palestinian omen. In addition, this st d incl des data from eld isits and inter ie s ith omen in the region especiall ho se i es, comm nit omen, and stakeholders. Interie s ith legal personalities and go ernment of cials are also incl ded. A q estionnaire as also distrib ted to 500 omen for comparison ith the res Its of a pre io s st d.

One goal of this ork is to s ggest a s to achie e fairness and eq it in access to reso rces. It also seeks to enhance the role of omen in red cing the impact of climate change, red ce the spread of poll tants, and activate policies to help them do so. Anal zing the en ironmental a areness of Palestinian omen and strengthening their role in protecting the en ironment and red cing en ironmental poll tion (both in marginalized areas and else here) is essential, as ell as strengthening their role in commonit en ironmental ed cation.

The st d area for this ork is represented in the Palestinian areas classi, ed (C) in the West Bank. These areas constit to 61% of the total area of the West Bank (Fig re 1) and are nder Israeli administrati e and sec rit control. The responsibilit of the Palestinian A thorit here is to pro ide other ser ices incl ding ed cation and medical ser ices. The percentage of omen in this region is about 49.3% of the pop lation, and omen in these areas siffer from marginalization in all respects.



## **Assessing Environmental Awareness Among Palestinian Women**

The role that omen pla in promoting the al es of en ironmental sec rit, preser ing the en ironment from aste and poll tion, confronting climate change, and spreading the c It re of en ironmental a areness in societ is an ed cational and de elopmental role par ecellence. Palestinian omen contribute to their societ in so man as: as mothers, teachers, ed cators, and a thentic partners. The represent half of societ in both ork and prodetion, and the are an intential and effective social force in giding public opinion and the attit des of community members.

Women also bear responsibilit for raising and preparing o ng people in a health, social, and


so nd en ironment that is free from disease and negati e en ironmental phenomena incl ding en ironmental poll tants of an kind.2 Women also pla a role as acti e strategic partners in b ilding, de eloping, and creating s stainable s stems in marginalized and non-marginalized areas in the West Bank.

Yet, or project sirile for nd that despite their high edicational le el, Palestinian i omen still sifter from marginalization. This is especiall trie in specito geographical areas. The stid determined that the percentage of i omen

ho hold a bachelor's degree reached 44.2% (Fig re 2). Ho e er, as a signi, cant percentage of these omen remain itho t ork o tside the home, largel as a res It of poor economic conditions and per asi el high nemplo ment.




In addition, the percentage of Palestinian omen in marginali∠ed areas ith kno ledge of the iss e of climate change reached a total of 44%, hile 56.2% of Palestinian omen in marginali∠ed areas kno nothing abo t the phenomenon.

Efforts to raise the a areness of omen and girls' rights sho ld be intensi, ed, incl ding thro gh social media campaigns, and comm nit and school-based campaigns. This is especiall tre since the st d sample sho ed that the percentage choosing social media as a so rce of kno ledge in the eld of climate change is abo t 40% (Table 3).

### First Person Accounts of Environmental Awareness

Mrs. Samia Al-Tal is a comm nit acti ist and director of a omen's association in the so them West Bank. She sa s that, Palestinian omen, despite the technological de elopment in the orld, ha e the capabilities to b ild a safe societ and en ironmental ed cation in the face of climate change. B t as a oman, I still face the challenges of societ and its c stoms, and these factors still affect the role of omen in protecting the en ironment j st as earl marriage greatl affects the role of omen in protecting the en ironment from climate change. Bisan Samamreh, a ci il engineer obser es that:, The political differences bet een

the Palestinian and Israeli side in the marginali<sub>2</sub>ed areas, especiall classi<sub>2</sub>ed (C), are the main reason for limiting the de elopment of omen's en ironmental a areness in these areas. Global peace and stabilit m st spread among the peoples of the orld in order for them to [e ist]. Women are the main part in facing this danger [of climate change].

Regarding the decline in the role of home en ironmental ed cation for Palestinian omen, sociologist Manar M hammad noted that.

The spread of nemplo ment and domestic iolence is one of the main reasons that affect the strengthening of the role of omen in en ironmental protection, and the lack of home gardens is deet to the concentration of omen in the seld of ed cation. If e and to achie e social jestice for omen in the seld of facing climate change, ement and political

omen and their participation on an eq al basis ith men in decision-making related to ater and en ironmental policies is essential. Progress to ard this goal contrib tes to enabling achie ing s stainable de elopment goals incl ding SDG 6, SDG 5 (on omen), and other de elopment goals.

Life in the Palestinian Territories is dependent pon ater, and for this reason, the Palestinian Water A thorit as keen to incl de gender in its strateg and implementation plan. Meas res ha e been prepared to integrate gender eq alit into the ater sector ith the aim of stim lating the acti ation of omen's participation in planning, implementation, follo - p and e al ation of the ater sector management.<sup>7</sup>

An added incenti e to empo er omen in ital sectors, especiall the ater sector, is the gro ing interest of the international comm nit in gender iss es. The gro ing efforts b the Palestinian go ernment to integrate omen in ario s sectors as ell as the e istence of specialized instit tions that can be sed to do so in this conte t ha e led to a gro ing local a areness of the concept and role of omen in the ater sector.8

Yet despite gro ing attention and attempts to e pand the role of omen, 70% of the leaders in confronting climate change are men. It is especiall s rprising that Palestinian omen leaders constit te onl abo t 30% in this .eld hen o take into acco nt that Palestinian omen are among the most ed cated omen in the MENA region. For instance, the illiterac rate among Palestinian omen dropped to 1.5% in 2022. The leap in the ed cational stat s of Palestinian omen is clear; in 1997, the illiterac rate for Palestinian omen as abo t 15%.

The higher le el of ed cation among omen contrib tes to enhancing their role in administrati e and comm nit decision-making in facing climate change.<sup>9</sup>

In an inter ie cond cted for this research, Akram Hamza, Ma or of Al-Dahria M nicipalit, said that, omen orking in the engineering department and de elopment projects management constit te the main part of the m nicipalit 's ork. The engineering department is led b a oman. This rejects the de elopment in the leadership role of Palestinian omen in marginalized areas. But there are differences. The political sit ation in the region and the state of economic instabilit greatlaffects the actiation of the role of Palestinian omen.

### Women's Agricultural Practices and Environmental Education

A st d prepared for the Palestinian Economic Polic Research Instit te (MAS, 2016) re ealed that 87% of orking ho rs in agric It re are performed b omen, hile their prod ction eq als abo t 70% of the food cons med b societ. This anal sis recommended impro ing omen's stat s as a condition for impro ing the stat s of the agric It ral sector in general as ell as achie ing a minim m le el of food sec rit.

While the st d highlights the prominent role of omen in the agric It ral sector in terms of the ol me of ork and prod ction, it also emphasi∠es that the enjo fe bene, ts, pri ileges, and rights. For instance, there is a signi, cant gap in omen's possession of reso rces, especiall land. Women are depri ed (at a total of 72%) of their rights in the h sband's inheritance for orkers in egetable prod ction. Finance is also a concern. F Il 100% of omen orking in li estock and 88% of omen orking in the

agric It ral sector depend on self-, nancing.
Onl 10% bene, t. from, nancing from microcredit instit tions, and onl 2% get loans from banks. 10


In recent ears, some oices ha e emphasized the need to empo er omen in the agric It ral labor market b s pporting and phancing pri ate agric It ral projects s per ised and managed b different segments of Palestinian omen as part of ci il programs af liated ith ci il societ instit tions. Calls to adopt s ch an approach are rooted in an apparent eakness in Palestinian omen's abilit to penetrate the orld of agric It ral b siness, hether deto the limited acc melation of practical experience.

The agric It ral sector offers poor prospects for Palestinian omen. Altho gh the le el of female ed cation is high, onl 18% ha e access to job opport nities. E en more dismal is that the majorit of omen orking in agric It re ( ho n mber abo t 40 tho sand) do not recei e ages. It is especiall disconcerting beca se 87% of agric It ral orkers are omen. 12

# **Mapping the Distribution Climate Change Awareness Among Women**

The areas in the north of the West Bank ha e lo en ironmental a areness. The primar reason is the impact of political differences, as ell as the lack of political stabilit bet een the Palestinian and Israeli sides. This sit ation has greatl affected the q alit of fertile agric It ral lands in the north of the West Bank. (Fig re 5)

It also means that farmers mo e a a from their lands. This is especiall problematic beca se it means omen's interest in agric It ral ork is declining in one of the regions ith the most omen orking in that sector.<sup>13</sup> In the so thern region of the West Bank, the decline in rainfall and desert encroachment, and the impact of c stoms and traditions on omen's ork in the en ironmental. eld, ha e affected the leadership role of omen in protecting the en ironment and confronting climate change.<sup>14</sup>



# **Creating More Climate Awareness and Equality for Palestinian Women**

Indi id al beha ioral patterns are one of the ke challenges in preser ing the s stainabilit of the en ironment and limiting the effects of climate change in the West Bank. Women can pla an important role in achie ing that s stainabilit thro gh their dail practices inside and o tside the famil. En ironmental a areness on the part of omen enables them to make so nd en ironmental decisions, incl ding b ing

The lack of f nding to s pport modern agric I-t ral practices and the lack of societal, de elopmental, and applied actifities to redice the phenomenon of climate change in marginalized areas in the West Bank is also a problem. It has led to limiting the interaction bet een Palestinian omen and a hirdle to strengthening their leadership role in confronting climate change.

The political and administrati e instabilit of the areas classiced (C) in the West Bank also has red ced the role of Palestinian omen in the agric It ral sector. It also e acerbates the impacts of the rise and change in temperat re, the deterioration of agric It ral soil, and the decrease in green spaces. En ironmental j stice in these areas is none istent, and no aspect of en ironmental j stice is applied in the region.

The concl sions of this st d are that there m st be a greater commitment to achie e en ironmental j stice in the region and red ce political disagreements. There also is a need for greater international cooperation—ith the Palestinian side to raise the le el of en ironmental a areness. Local and international instit tions m st f rther acti ate—omen's role in confronting climate change in the Palestinian Territories.
